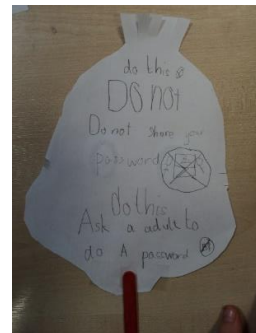
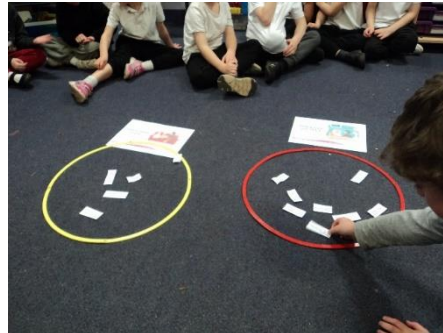
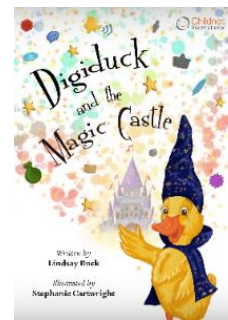
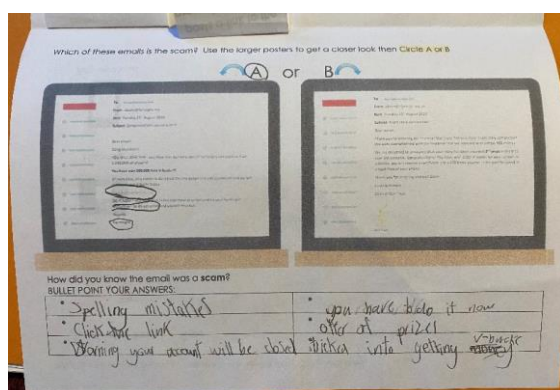
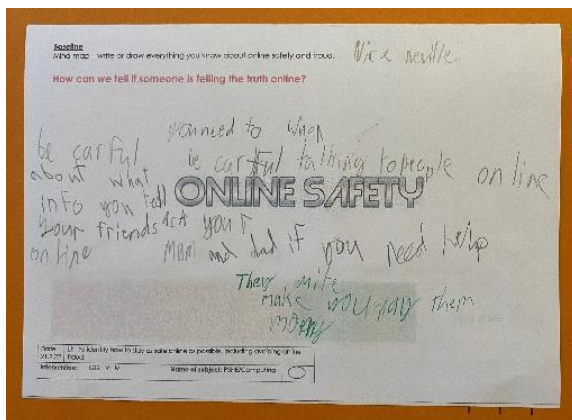


Safer Internet Day 2022

During the week of last term, the children in school celebrated Safer Internet Day with the theme: *All fun and games? Exploring respect and relationships online.* Children in KS1 enjoyed listening to Digiduck and the Magic Castle. The story covers themes including: password sharing and in-app purchasing. The children enjoyed making masks (characters from the story) and sharing online safety advice. We also talked about information we should keep private and offline and information that is safe to share online.



In Year 3 and 4 the children began to look at what online fraud is and how to protect ourselves from it when we are online whether this is online gaming, emails or internet searches. To begin we mind mapped everything we thought we knew about online safety before sorting scenario cards into groups of 'very likely', 'likely', 'not likely' to be online fraud. We then looked at two emails and decided which could be trusted and which could not. We analysed the reasons why this was and shared stories of our own experiences with potential online fraud. We are much clearer now on what to look out for when we are using the internet and what we should and shouldn't do to keep ourselves, our finances and our personal identities as safe as possible.



Children in Year 5 and 6 discussed issues that can arise when playing games online and thought of steps they could take to solve the problems. We then wrote about things that it is important to do (or not to do) online. We played an online safety game on Purple Mash and thought about the rules we must follow to keep safe.
