### **Attendance**

We are absolutely determined to avoid children missing school for any other reason than severe illness. Before COVID, our whole school attendance was around 97% at this time of year. This year it is 94%. This is because many children are missing lots of school for coughs and colds. There is no reason to keep your child off if they have a cough or cold, we are happy to administer Calpol (or any other medicine needed) with your permission. The classrooms are warm and dry unlike during COVID when we had to keep windows and doors open. Please do not keep your child off school for anything other than severe illnesses as missing even half a day at school can mean they miss important learning.

This is a chance for people to have a tour around the school, hear a short talk from the Headteacher and then find out some useful information about school dinners/admissions/uniform etc.

## HAWK CLASS LEARNING

## <u>Literacy</u>

In literacy, we have finished our unit on setting descriptions where we used our knowledge of the trenches in the First World War to describe the horrific setting. We used a range of features to ensure our writing was successful: ambitious vocabulary, figurative language and varied sentence structure. The final drafts were both descriptive and moving.

## **Science**

This half term, our unit is light. We have learnt how light travels in a straight line and looked at how light can be reflected by learning about the laws of reflection. From our understanding, we were able to make our own periscopes which linked in well with our learning about WWI. This week we looked at how shadows are formed. We used the torches to investigate how shadows change size depending on the distance.







## <u>History</u>

The whole of the Autumn term we look at the WWI and WWII. We really enjoyed our trip to the Imperial War museum and it was a great way to immerse us in the topic. In lessons we have looked at the start of WWI. We created trench models in DT and sketched landscapes in art. Last week we looked at the Blitz and wrote speeches persuading people to support the war effort. This week, we had Mrs Deacon come in to talk about her family history and links to both the first and second world war.








## **Religious Education**

In RE, this half term, we are looking at the religion of Hinduism. We looked at Brahman who is shown in many forms but is the one supreme God. We looked at how we are one person with many different roles and characteristics. We also looked at murtis (images of gods) and their symbolism. We created our own murti to represent the things that are important to us.
