

Year 2 Learning - FOX Class

<u>Literacy</u>

Fox class have made a brilliant start to Year 2 and the children are really enjoying learning in all their subjects. In literacy we have been reading 'Room on the

Broom'. After using the book as a way to learn about homophones, suffixes and how to create character descriptions, the children are now creating their own versions of the story. We role-played the original story before starting our plans to further familiarise



ourselves with 'Room on the

Broom' and to help us identify the main parts of the story.



MATHS

Our current topic in maths is Place Value. The children have been learning how to write numbers in words, partition numbers into tens and ones and this week we have started to learn about 10s and 1s on


number lines. Thanks to the help of Badger class the children created a human number line. The children tried to work out what number they represented by counting on from 1 and back from 50.

Bring your homemade goodies before school on Friday 30th September to the family room.


All entries will be sold for charity on the Bake Sale stall in the church hall at the Fayre.
