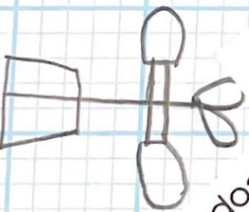
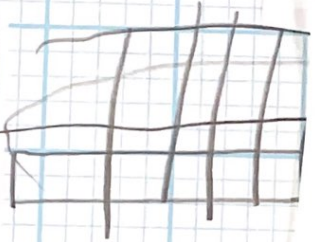
Canvas walls on 3 sides provide shelter

# The Symbols of the Bar/Bat Mitzvah

Name	Picture	What are they? The cloth hat worn to remind people that God is above them.
Kippa		
Kiddes cup		A cup used when the wine or grape juice is blessed on Shabbat (The Jewish day of rest).  A Bar Mitzvah is able to perform this blessing.
Prayer boxes		Small black boxes containing parchment scrolls that are worn on the arms and head to remind a Jewish man that God is in their heart and soul.
Torah		The sacred scroll of religious teachings. Part of this is sung or said by the Bar or Bat Mitzvah.
Tallit		A prayer shawl with 613 knots. Each knot represents the 613 Mitzvots (Jewish laws) that must be fulfilled now a person is a Bar or Bat Mitzvah.
Shabbat candles		The candles used to welcome Shabbat into a household.  A Bat Mitzvah lights the candles.
