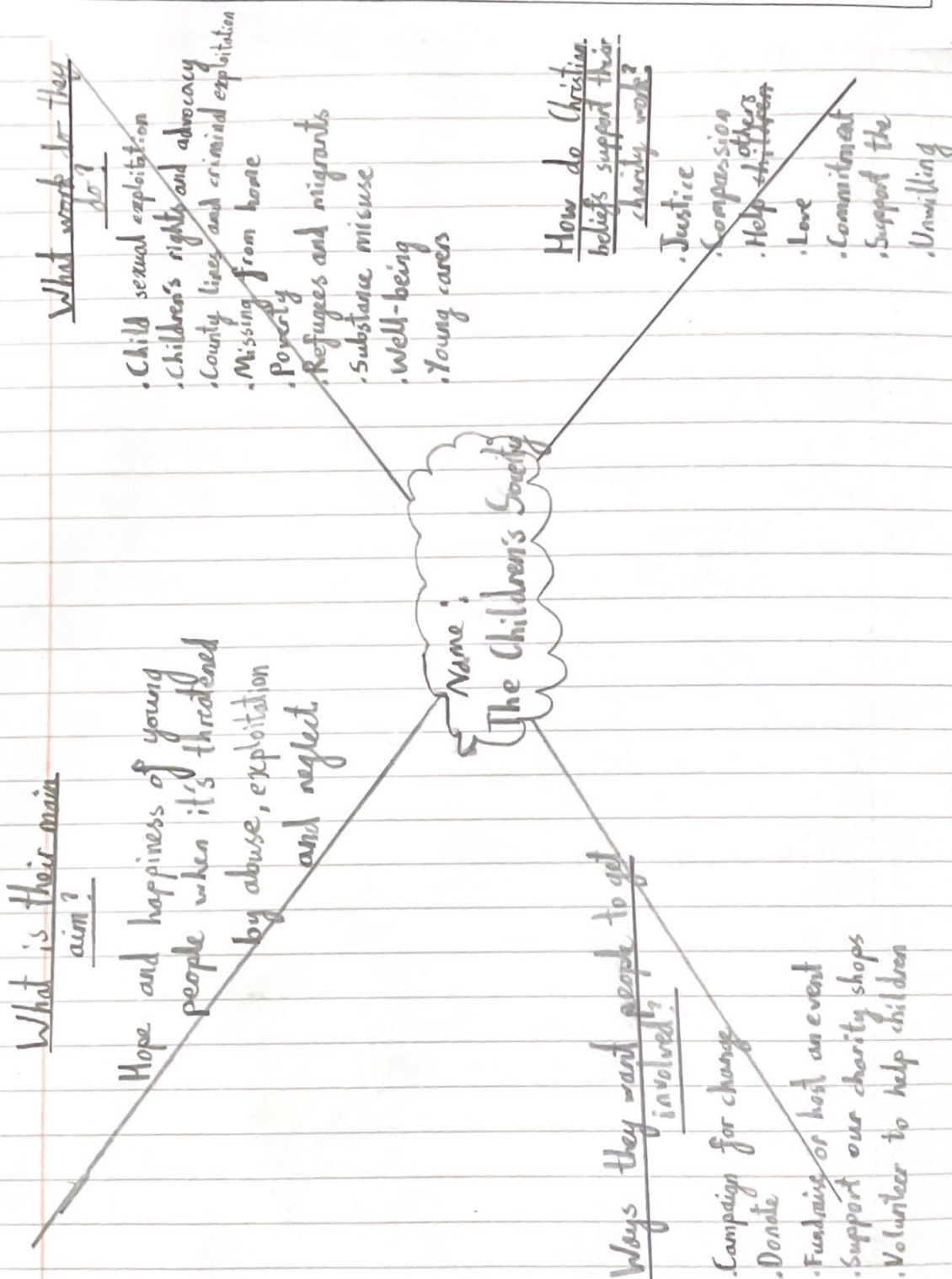
As a class, we designed a community picture to illustrate Christian belief in action. Thinking about the question- what would Jesus do?
