
Hawk and Badger

What are the benefits of Paired Reading?

Paired reading is an incredibly useful and important tool in school. By working in pairs, children learn from each other and as well as improving reading; this also targets communication, teamwork, empathy, understanding and responding to another person's needs.

Improving reading fluency helps children to feel comfortable reading aloud to larger groups, contributing to an overall boost in confidence. As children read more books and other literary materials including poetry and plays, their imagination and love for reading is ignited leading to a great lifelong relationship with reading and books.



We are so proud of you Ellie!





Learning in Squirrel Class

This week has been a very busy week in squirrel class! In **maths**, we have been ordering numbers from greatest to smallest and smallest to greatest. We used numicon to help us make the numbers. Together, we also solved some challenging problem solving and reasoning questions.



In **literacy**, we finished writing our diaries based on Ruby's adventure in 'Ruby's Chinese New Year'. The children have been extremely committed to their writing. In their diaries they included time conjunctions, wrote sentences in the past tense (adding -ed) and used their phonics knowledge to write phonically plausible words. They were all superb!



In **guided reading** we have been reading a lovely book called 'The Magic Paintbrush' by Julia Donaldson. Shen, a young girl, is gifted a magic paintbrush and what she paints comes to life! In the story she encounters an evil emperor and she has to think fast about




how she can escape from him! In class we talked about the vocabulary: seize, emperor, scowls, wealthy and oysters.

In **PSHE**, we learned about how we care for people and animals in different ways. We had a special visitor in class to help us with our learning: Lindy Williams Crystal Gattety! We talked about what you need to do to care for a hamster and how to keep it healthy and safe. Some of the children had a cuddle, a stroke and fed her. She was a little tired later in the afternoon and snuggled into her bedding for a good sleep.



During **free flow**, the children have been making models (homes for Lindy!), using playdough and sticks to make 2D and 3D shapes and painting and decorating some Chinese lanterns for our class display.
