



This week Maple Class have been very busy in the afternoons during science and geography. We have been looking at the weather and the water cycle and how they affect climates. Using a glass, cling film and hot water, we were able to recreate the processes of evaporation, condensation and precipitation. The children were very excited to see it raining indoors!
