Meanwhile, we only have 10 more days until the March wristbands will be given out as well as the golden 100% badges at the end of this term!



Year 5 and 6 had a fantastic visit to The Science Museum this week. The trip by train and underground went smoothly. The children behaved impeccably, were inquisitive and eager to learn about all aspects of science. They particularly enjoyed *The Wonderlab* - an interactive experience where they

investigated friction on giant slides, enjoyed a live demonstration at the Chemistry lab and experienced the power of electricity.

Our main topic for this term is transport. We have enjoyed learning about how we are all different and the different people who help us. We have put helping others into practice by role playing mechanics fixing vehicles for one another, which has enabled us to learn lots of new vocabulary. Whilst digging up sand with the diggers we have learnt words like full, empty, heavy and light. We have enjoyed retelling our story 'Duck in the Truck' in our role play area. We have made cars in the art area and learnt about colour mixing whilst painting with toy cars. We've had a particular focus on name writing recently. In maths, we've been learning number bonds and shapes.
