

To launch our new topic, 'Local history' (linked to buildings and homes) children in Year 1 and 2 visited St Johns school in Leatherhead. The children were given a tour of the school and visited the chapel, dining hall and the new sports centre. The sports centre was very impressive and the children were excited to learn that our Year 3 children use the pool for their lessons. The children learned some historical facts about the school including that the school moved three times before settling in Leatherhead and that the infirmary was built in 1881. They also discovered that the school was burnt down in 1913 by a pupil. The rumours at the time were that the suffragettes (who were in town) were responsible for this but this was not the case! 








The children also got to meet Topsy Ojo - ex England and London Irish rugby player. The children asked him lots of questions. Topsy spends a lot of his time on the road travelling to

- **FFLAG** stands for Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays. Supportive guides are available on how to support your child, of any age, before and after they have come out.
- Family Lives have information about how to support your child if they are gay, lesbian, bisexual or transgender.
