The children have been learning about the Equator, the Northern Hemisphere and Southern Hemisphere and how this effects each part of the world giving us different climates.

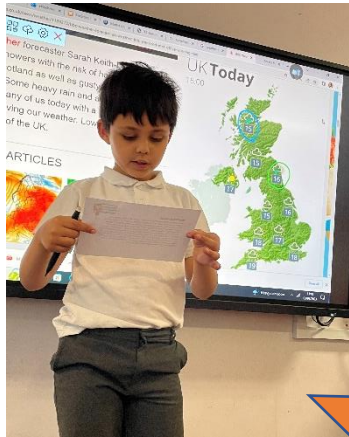

BEAKY MALONE Worst ever school trip

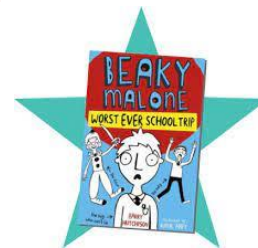

Eagle Class Learning

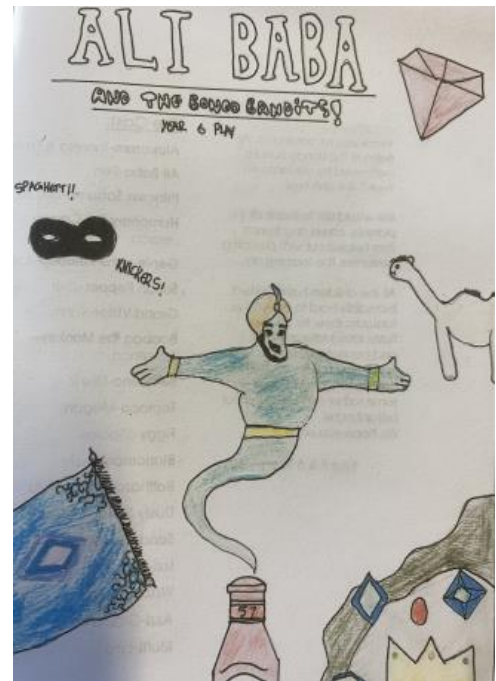
Eagle class have been having an even busier time than usual over the last two weeks as we prepare for the end of year shows and church services.

Over the last few weeks, we have enthusiastically learnt, memorised and sung (some of the more creative children even created routines to go along with each of the songs) the songs for the Year 6 show, 'Ali Baba and the Bongo Bandits.' Last week, we started practising with Year 6 in our hall, this week we had our first rehearsal in the theatre at St John's swiftly followed by our first performance with a live audience of Years 1 and 2 on Thursday. The show is a genuine extravaganza and an assault (in the nicest possible way) on the senses. Book your tickets now. Don't miss out.

Returning to the curriculum, we are finishing our explanation texts about the ancient Egyptian process of mummification. This has been particularly fascinating as we recently saw some genuine 3,000 year old mummies in the British Museum therefore learning how this preservation is possible has been truly eye-opening. We have made this an informal piece of writing with a chatty style and the injection of humour. For example a couple of children opened with the line, "My mother told me to marry an Egyptian: they make great mummies."

In maths, we have started learning about metric conversions. Having mastered multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1,000 and looked at equivalence between fractions and decimal numbers it has been a natural next step.
