Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the new academic year! It has been wonderful to welcome back the children and to meet our new families. Our Reception starters had their first settling in sessions this week and all children will be in school full time from Monday.

As the weather is very hot at the moment, please can we remind you that <u>children can wear summer uniform</u> during this unexpected heat.

Start and finish times

Our new school day **starts at 8.50am** – this is 5 minutes earlier than our previous start to the day. Thank you to all parents and carers who are arriving to school on time in order for the children to start their days promptly. The school gates will remain open until 9.05am to allow exiting parents to leave the site. If you arrive with your child after 8.50am then please report to the school office – entry into the classrooms via external classroom doors will not be possible after 8.50am. Nursery's day starts at 9am.

Our new school day **finishes at 3.20pm** – this is 10 minutes later for Reception and KS1 than last academic year. As we have stated in previous communication, this means that the car park will be much busier. Therefore, we would strongly recommend that you only **park on site if absolutely necessary** as parking will be **very limited**. If you do park on site, please park in the marked bays - please do not parallel park on any of the roads or across any walkways. **Parking outside of a designated bay is very dangerous**, not only to pedestrians but to other drivers as well. Parking outside of designated bays also causes congestion as vehicles are not able to enter and exit the car parks freely.

We would suggest that if you do need to drive to school, please consider parking in a side road (not Woodvill Road as this is a private road). Of course, walking to school wherever possible would be our strongest recommendation. Thank you to the many parents who do consistently walk come rain or shine!

Reading Volunteers Needed!

As part of our continued efforts to raise the standards of literacy in school, we are hoping to encourage volunteers to come into school and help pupils with their reading. Reading regularly to an adult has been shown to significantly increase the rate of progress that children can make with their reading.

Typically, you would work one-to-one with children spending time with each child talking about the book that they are reading and listening to them read. You would work with the same children each week getting to know them and watching them progress.

Ideally, you would be able to commit to coming into school for a regular slot one or two afternoons a week.

For safeguarding reasons, all volunteers must go through a DBS process in order to work with children. This may take some time to process before you are able to start. We ask that you would be able to commit to volunteering with us for at least a term.


