Reading

- Read at least 5 times per week
- Encourage your child to read a variety of texts
- A balance between listening to them read out loud and them reading silently
- Ask your child questions about the text to ensure understanding

- Access e-books, comics, and audiobooks
- Filter audience juvenile



Reading-Borrow Box

- Sign up with your Surrey Library Card
- Audiobooks only
- Filter audience juvenile



Behaviour
