LEARNING IN OSPREY

READING

Since the start of term, we've had a big push on reading and in particular, reading for pleasure. The children have loved using the library and our 'Bookflix' board in class to discover the brilliant books in our reading corner-



including books by our author of the half term, Malorie Blackman. We've just started reading 'Percy Jackson & The Lightning Thief' by Rick Riordan for our class story and in guided reading we have been studying, 'The Odyssey.' Both of the texts link fantastically to our topic on Ancient Greece.



LITERACY

We've been working hard in literacy, writing our own poems linked to Greek mythical creatures: Medusa, Hydra, Cyclops and Pegasus to name a few. We started by looking at various poems for

inspiration and then researching our creatures to find out more. We've gathered vocabulary and practised using figurative language to use in the final drafts of our poems. Some are really quite scary!







SCIENCE

Our science unit this half term is space. Last week, we learnt about the planets in our solar system and

how they differ. We created our very own planets out of plasticine, considering the size and order they are from the sun. This week, we compared the size of the planets and the distance they are from the sun with the help some 'fruit and





veg-' we had a blueberry Venus and a watermelon Jupiter. We went outside with our trundle wheel to map out a scaled down version of our solar system. At one point we did lose Mercury as our peppercorn rolled away!

Protecting children on mobile devices

The online world gives us access to a huge amount of information and services, but the scale of information available also means that there is content that is inappropriate for children. What is or isn't appropriate is up to individual parents and carers to decide, and could be based on things like age, ability, beliefs and family values.

The <u>NSPCC</u> have advice on how to decide what is appropriate for children online. Their website explains what parental controls are and how to set these up on various devices, such as games consoles.

Samsung Kids Parental Controls

Samsung have released a app called Samsung Kids and this is a parental feature which you can set up on your child's device which can be used to apply restrictions such as app access, downloading, screen time, privacy and more. It's really easy to set up and use and will help you to manage your child's online activity.
