Oak Class Learning



Oak class have had a very exciting and busy term. We have started our geography topic – Europe – and had an excellent immersion day. We were lucky enough to go on a European tour, through VR headsets. We travelled back in time to ancient Rome and saw a gladiator fight in the Colosseum. We then came to 2023 and visited the cold north of Finland to see the Northern Lights. We also travelled to Paris and finally we went deep into the earth in Romania and looked around salt caves.





Throughout the rest of the day, we taste tested food from around Europe – the favourite was definitely the Polish sausage before practising our map reading skills by finding landmarks around the school and writing their coordinates or a map.







Last Friday, year 4 were lucky enough to visit Leatherhead Library. We were given a tour; we talked all about our favourite books and were able to pick one off the shelf to collect when we next went back. Some children went back the next day with their library cards and took out



their book and those that have not already joined the library were told what they have to do in order to become a member.

Finally, we love our exercise in Oak class. Last week, we completed over 1,000 burpees across the week as our Children in Need challenge. We have also been working on

completing the daily mile in a quicker time than at the start of the term. To do this, we have been

not just running but also doing workouts in the classroom with a focus on our leg and arm muscles and running in pairs to encourage others to push themselves as much as they can. It has been fantastic to see the improvement in the children's fitness and happiness when we get back to our learning.

is about how to regulate our



East Surrey Domestic Abuse Service (ESDAS) is an independent charity providing outreach for people that have been affected by domestic abuse. They are not the police or social services, but can work closely with them if appropriate.

ESDAS offer a range of services for people living in Reigate & Banstead, Mole Valley and Tandridge.

ESDAS can offer:

- Confidential listening service to anyone affected by abuse and violence
- Can give practical advice on a legal position and can put you in touch with solicitors who are experienced in domestic abuse issues
- Apply for benefits that you may be entitled to
- Help you look at your children's needs
- Arrange transport to leave your home
- Put you in touch with other caring agencies and sources of help
- Can talk to you on the phone or meet you face to face about concerns you may have in your relationship
