#### **Bumblebee Class Learning**

We have been learning about different festivals and traditions as part of our topic celebrations, linking in to the story Kipper's Birthday. The children have enjoyed reading a range of story, and information, books about birthdays, Diwali and Hanukah.

They have created Rangoli patterns and birthday cakes using a range of materials and techniques in the art area. They have also enjoyed the role play area celebrating many birthdays.







In maths we have been looking at number recognition and exploring the composition of numerals using double counters, multilink cubes and numicons.

In phonics children have begun to use phonemes to blend sounds into words. They have started to use this skill independently, taking ownership of their reading and writing.









The big highlight of this term has been practising our songs and lines for our nativity performance, that we hope you have all enjoyed.

#### Year 1 workshop - Learning About The Tuba

During Monday afternoon, Roger Graham, who teaches piano at our school talked to our year 1 children about playing the tuba. The children learned that the tuba is the largest member of the

brass family of instruments and has the lowest pitch. They discovered that the tuba is played by vibrating your lips against the mouth piece. The children really enjoyed having a go at playing the tuba themselves. It was harder than you might think but that didn't put off our children from wanting to have a go! The children learned that tubas have valves to help produce different sounds and that these are used to change the length of tubing that air can pass through. 








#### **Redwood Class Learning**

In literacy this week, the children have been busy finishing their final writing based on the book we have been reading called 'Stig of the Dump'. The key focus was introducing paragraphs and being able to apply this to their own independent work. The children picked a scene from the book and created their own prediction of how it ends. As shown below, the children have created their own descriptive and fascinating stories.







Freddie's book recommendation- 'I like Stig of the Dump because some people can learn about what it's like to live in the Stone Age. I think it's very inspirational. My favourite character is Stig because I like his style and the way he fights.'



In maths, we have been focusing on multiplication and division. As a class, we have been playing games and songs which all the children thoroughly enjoyed, and has created a fun and competitive environment of learning. The children have been challenging themselves this week by multiplying and dividing by 8. To help us through our learning journey, we used counters to help us visually understand the steps of division and multiplications.

In topic, we have been focusing on Europe this term. The children had an amazing (and messy) lesson on Wednesday creating their own landmarks.

The children were put into groups and carefully planned out the resources they need for their specific landmarks. Shown below are the different landmarks the children have created. The children in Redwood took lots of time and thought into their creation and are very proud of how they have turned out.





#### Mental Health and Well-Being

Christmas is often a time of year that puts extra pressure on us, and can affect out mental health in lots of different ways.

For example, if you:

- Feel alone or left out because everyone else seems happy when you're not
- Wish you didn't have to deal with Christmas, or find it stressful because of other events in your life
- Feel frustrated by other people's views of a 'perfect' Christmas, if these feel different to your experiences
- Have ideas about what Christmas should be like, feel as if you need to enjoy it or worry something will ruin it
- Feel like Christmas gives you something to focus on and look forward to, and find it difficult when it's over
- Want to celebrate with someone who's struggling

There are many agencies you can turn to for support, some of these are listed below:

#### **Mindworks**

If you are worried about a child or young person aged 6 plus, please call Mindworks 24/7 mental health crisis line free on 0800 915 4644 to talk with a trained call handler who will provide advice, support and signposting to a range of community services. It's open all day and all night, seven days a week. You can use the number whether or not you are already receiving mental health services. No formal request for support is needed.

#### Mindworks Surrey

Mindworks Surrey is the emotional wellbeing and mental health service for children, young people and families.
