People who help us in the community

Year 1 and 2

This week has been a very busy week for year 1 and 2. Not only did they all perform amazingly well in their Christmas production, 'Christmas with the Aliens' they also had some visitors - people who help us in the community. Richard an Emergency Transport Attendant (ETA) and Ian who works in the police came to talk to the children. In PSHE, we have been learning about people who help us.





In literacy, we have been learning to ask questions, and the children put their knowledge to the test and asked Richard and Ian lots of questions. The children learned that the role of an ETA is to provide accident and emergency care inside and outside of an ambulance. Through questioning, they learned that Richard began his career as an electrician but soon realised that he wanted to help people, which led him to volunteering with St John Ambulance and then training to become an

ETA. The children were shown how to apply a bandage and Richard very kindly left each class with some for the children to practice.

On Friday, the children were visited by Ian who works for the police and is responsible for handling emergency calls. The children learned that there are three emergency services: police, fire and

ambulance and that when a call to the police is answered they have to ask where is the incident, who it involves, when it happened and what happened. Lots of information to gather! The children were happy to learn that police dog handlers can take their dogs home with them.



Year 1 also had another special visitor, Fred the school's therapy dog. This week the children have been reading and looking at different acrostic poems. Next week, the children will be writing their own acrostic poems about Fred.
