LEARNING IN BADGER CLASS

On Wednesday Badger class enjoyed celebrating Black History Day.







We learned about Bob Marley's life and wrote our fact files about him.

We truly enjoyed listening to some of his music, digging deep into the meaning of his positive and powerful lyrics. We had fun coming up with our dancing movements and actions for them. We learned that Reggae is a very popular music genre that was originated in Jamaica in the late 1960's.

We also looked at some geographical and cultural differences between Jamaica and where we live and compared them.



We used different art techniques to make posters to put on display with the title of one of his songs "One Love" and

linked this session to our Christian Values. The children come out with some fantastic ideas in how we show LOVE.







Fireworks



This weekend, FOLT are holding the annual fireworks display at the school. This has been carefully planned, to ensure that the children and adults who attend are kept safe.

Fireworks can be great fun for families, but can be incredibly dangerous. Despite safety warnings, firework celebrations still end in painful injuries for too many people, including very young children.

Injury figures support the advice that the safest place to enjoy fireworks is at a large public display far fewer people are injured here than at smaller family or private parties.

But if you are having a firework party at home, you can make the occasion fun and safe for everyone by following the Firework Code, as well as some sparkler and bonfire safety tips.

Firework Code

Only adults should deal with setting up firework displays, the lighting of fireworks and the safe disposal of fireworks once they have been used (and remember, alcohol and fireworks don't mix!). Children and young people should be supervised, and watch and enjoy fireworks at a safe distance.

Follow these top 10 tips for a safer fireworks party:

- 1. Plan your firework display to make it safe and enjoyable, and ensure it finishes before 11pm
- 2. Only buy fireworks which carry the CE mark, keep them in a closed box and use them one at a time
- 3. Read and follow the instructions on each firework using a torch if necessary
- 4. Light the firework at arm's length with a taper and stand well back
- 5. Keep naked flames, including cigarettes, away from fireworks
- 6. Never return to a firework once it has been lit
- 7. Don't put fireworks in pockets and never throw them
- 8. Direct any rocket fireworks well away from spectators
- 9. Never use paraffin or petrol on a bonfire
- 10. Make sure that the fire is out and surroundings are made safe before leaving.
