On Monday 10th June, Trinity pupils descended upon King George V Playing Fields, along with hundreds of other pupils from other local Surrey schools for the annual District Sports competition.

After a few weeks of dodgy weather, we were lucky enough to have a beautiful sunny day. After setting up our gazebo (the best in the whole of Surrey - in our opinion!) the children warmed up for their races.

The children from Year 3 - 6 competed in throwing, sprint races, relay and long distance. As always, it was very competitive and the children were fantastic.

Finalists: Alexander, Year 3, came second in his sprint race which took him to the final where he did really well, against a very tough field of runners.

Louka, Year 4, also came second in his sprint race. In the final, he came in the top five!

Benji, Year 6, came 4th in the 800m long distance race having been 1st for a large part, and overcoming a small collision with another runner.

Yarick, Year 6, taking part in the same 800m race came 6th. He worked very hard to keep his position in the race and had a very strong finish.

Finally, a special shout out to Demi, who completed in the most events out of everybody, and to Ellie-May, who took part in the 800m long distance race, which she had never done before, and did amazingly well!
