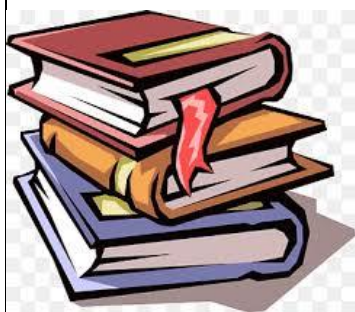

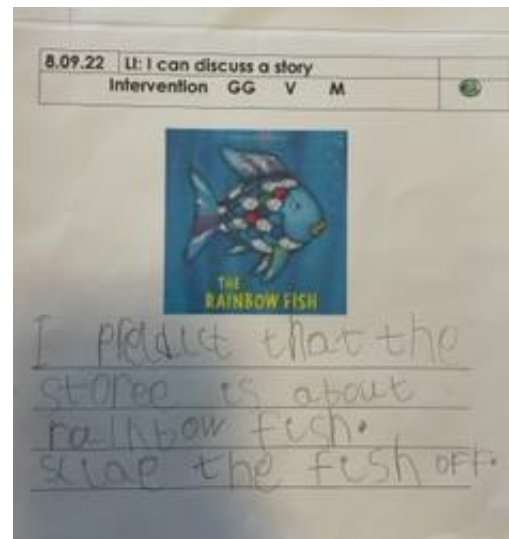

## Year 1 - Squirrel Class Learning

The first two weeks in Squirrel class have been busy! The children have settled really well and have been enthusiastic about their learning. In maths the children have been practising counting objects and they have shown fantastic resilience solving some tricky reasoning problems.



In literacy, we have been reading *The Rainbow Fish* and we have talked about what happened in the story, what we liked and what questions we would ask Rainbow Fish. We sequenced the events in the story and talked about what was happening in each of the pictures. The children have also settled well into their new Read Write Inc. groups and are learning new sounds, which will support their reading and writing.



During free flow, the children have also been very busy. They've used a range of materials to create artworks showing what lies beneath the sea, used the iPads to support their maths learning, made some fantastic models of rockets and boats in our construction area, counted pets in our maths area and performed songs in our theatre! The children have also been writing about their favourite toys.



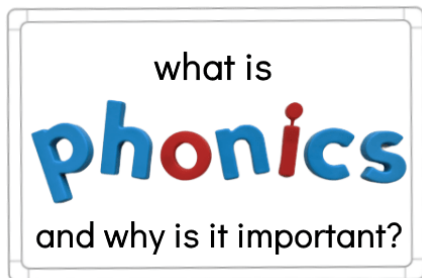




## PHONICS WORKSHOP Reception
